MONROE COUNTY, PA, August 29, 2018 – A press conference was held by the Pocono Mountains Visitors Bureau (PMVB), Monroe 2030, Monroe County Commissioners, and the Monroe County Council of Governments (COG) to announce an official county-wide litter pick-up day to take place one month from today, on September 29, 2018. The official name has been established as “Pick Up the Poconos Day,” named after the PMVB’s campaign “Pick Up the Poconos.” This event is rain or shine.

Now, the PMVB is requesting volunteers to participate in Pick Up the Poconos Day on September 29. Volunteers will receive free gifts from the PMVB and will be entered to win one of many prizes, including 4 waterpark passes to Great



Wolf Lodge, a \$100 Gift Certificate to the Hotel Fauchere, Dinner and a Show for 2 at Woodloch Resort, Laser Tag for 4 at Blue Mountain Resort, and much more. ## PLEASE CLEAR YOUR SIDEWALKS OF SNOW—IT’S THE LAW

The Borough of Stroudsburg has a snow and ice removal ordinance, in effect throughout the winter. The ordinance requires that the entire sidewalk shall be cleared of snow and ice after a storm. The timeframe to remove the snow and ice depends on when the storm ended and where the property is located. For properties with parking meters at the street line the law is:



Remove the snow and ice and deposit it into the street adjacent to the curb no later than 9 p.m. on the day the snow has fallen. For all others, homeowners, etc.: Please do not deposit snow in the street.

The law is: If the storm ended after 8 p.m., remove the snow/ice by 9 a.m. the next morning. If the storm ended after 9 a.m., remove the snow/ ice by 9 p.m. the same day. If ice cannot be cleared without damage to the sidewalk, it is required to be strewn with anti-skid material like sand, salt or a similar substance. Code officials issue citations for property owners who do not comply with the law.

## Stroudsburg's New Parking App

The Borough of Stroudsburg now offers **mPay2 mobile app** to pay all mechanical meters and/or pay stations in town. mPay2 offers quick and easy access to parking locations with efficient and safe payment methods.

Pay-by-cell parking allows customers to pay for parking with their smart phone by downloading the app and scanning the QR code located on the parking meter and/or pay station. Once scanned, essential information such as location, space and price are automatically provided. The app provides text message notification for expired parking sessions.

**YARD SALES**

Yard sales are allowed on the basis of two per year per residence. You must obtain a permit to have a yard sale. The permit covers two consecutive days and one “rain date”. The cost of the permit is only \$5.



## STROUDSBURG BOROUGH'S I-80 TASK FORCE UPDATE

The Stroudsburg Borough I-80 Project Task Force has been meeting regularly and is having a positive impact on the Route 80 Expansion Project by effectively communicating our concerns, ideas and local knowledge to PennDOT. As the project continues to evolve, our collective voice is being heard. The negative impacts of the project are being measurably reduced as careful revisions to the designs result in less property being needed to improve safety while maintaining travel convenience on the interstate corridor through our town.

Two leaders of our Task Force are representing the Borough’s citizens’ interests on a newly-formed Route 80 Project Advisory Committee. This new group, convened by PennDOT and the Engineering firm for the project, is intended to enhance public involvement in the project, and includes representatives from a broad, County-wide range of community business & non-profit interests, public agencies and elected officials.

The Borough’s Task Force continues to communicate information that we’ve learned about the project through the our website [www.i80projectimpactaaa.com](http://www.i80projectimpactaaa.com), on a Facebook page, and via presentations to local groups. We are also now identifying neighborhood contacts who are reaching out to neighbors to inform, to listen to concerns, and to help coordinate our responses when PennDOT finally schedules its next “Open House” presentation updating project specifics beyond the information available on their website, [www.i80project.com](http://www.i80project.com)

Currently one of the two preferred alternatives being further developed by the PennDOT team is “Option “D” depicted on their website <http://www.i80project.com/phase-2-alternative-d/> but that design is admittedly way out of date as work has progressed in the past couple of years. Our Task Force continues to keep our eyes on the project in order to enhance Awareness, Answers & Action (AAA)
